DENTAL HEALTH

Dentists identify and treat problems concerning a patient's mouth, gums and teeth. Their duties include extracting teeth, fitting dentures and filling cavities. Some dentists specialize in areas that range from treating oral problems and diseases to straightening teeth and performing oral surgeries. As members of a dental health team, dental hygienists clean teeth and dental assistants assist with recordkeeping and instrument sterilization. Laboratory technicians combine art and science by designing and manufacturing corrective devices and replacements for natural teeth.

From collecting samples, performing tests and conducting imaging examinations, these medical team members use the latest technology to analyze body fluids and tissue samples and to create diagnostic images. They also focus on biomedical research, supervision of laboratory testing, and the use of radioactive materials for diagnostic, therapeutic and research purposes. Some also train for careers as medicinal chemists in the pharmaceutical industry. Another component of this career field is preparing operating rooms and utilizing technology to treat respiratory diseases and sleep disorders.
